In August of 1941 almost the entire Jewish community of the Polish town of Tykocin was murdered by the invading Germans. In recent years the town has attracted approximately 100,000 visitors a year. It has become a major tourist attraction. The prime objective of this book is to relate the ways in which the Jews and the Jewish past of Tykocin are publicly memorialized and variously understood today by Jews and Poles alike. I examine present day renditions of the Jewish past as experienced
